Every year on the last Sunday in October, many churches set aside the day as "Reformation Sunday." Having not grown up with this tradition, and perhaps the same holds true for you, you may wonder as I did before I joined the Lutheran Church (the most awesome day in my life I might add!!!) where this tradition comes from and why some congregations, like Faith, continue to practice it. If you did grow up with this tradition, I pray this article serves as a reminder of where it all began....

In 1517, Pope Leo X offered indulgences for those who gave alms to rebuild St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. A friar by the name of Johann Tetzell preached aggressively – some commentaries note it as "marketing" – promoting this cause providing that the church would give those persons a certificate which acknowledged the gift and promised that they, or their loved ones, would be freed from a portion of the misery expected in the afterlife – reminds me of the Monopoly "get out of jail free card" but in this case it wasn't truly free. The certificates were known as "Indulgences" and No-

authority to absolve [forgive] a person from his/her sins. Indulgences were purchased with money!!!

vember 1st was an important day for the selling and buying of these indulgences. It was also the day before Martin Luther, a German monk during that time, posted a list of 95 Theses, that is 95 reasons, he condemned the selling of indulgences viewing them as the purchase and sale of salvation. Luther's posting was for the intention of debate.



He was firm in his understanding and belief that we are not forgiven because of anything we do, including the buying of Indulgences or doing enough good work; we are forgiven because of who God is and we are loved and forgiven because God is full of grace and mercy. Sound familiar? Yes, one of the "favorite" scriptures noted in our Bible Study groups taken from Paul's letter to the Ephesians: "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them."

Well, all this got Martin Luther into a lot of hot water and he was kicked out of the church. There were others who agreed with Luther and they became known as Lutherans, as well as Protestants (see the word "protest" in there? – because they "protested" to what was happening.)

Reformation Sunday gives us a chance to tell our story. In addition, Reformation Sunday also challenges us to do better. Most notably, Reformation Sunday is a reminder that the grace and mercy given to us in Jesus Christ is the foundation of our faith. You will hear more about this on Reformation Sunday here at Faith. Please join in worship and wear red!
